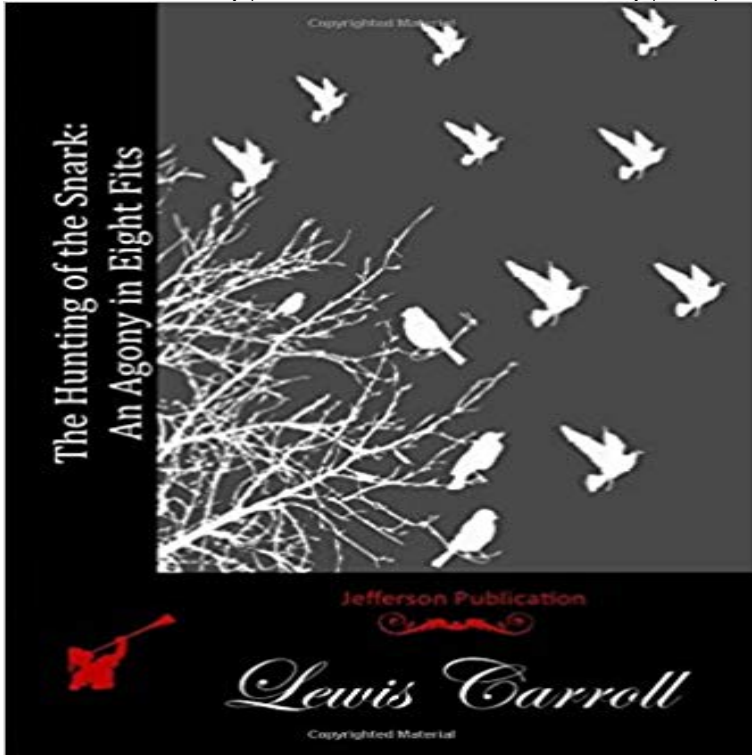


The Hunting of the Snark: An Agony in Eight Fits
