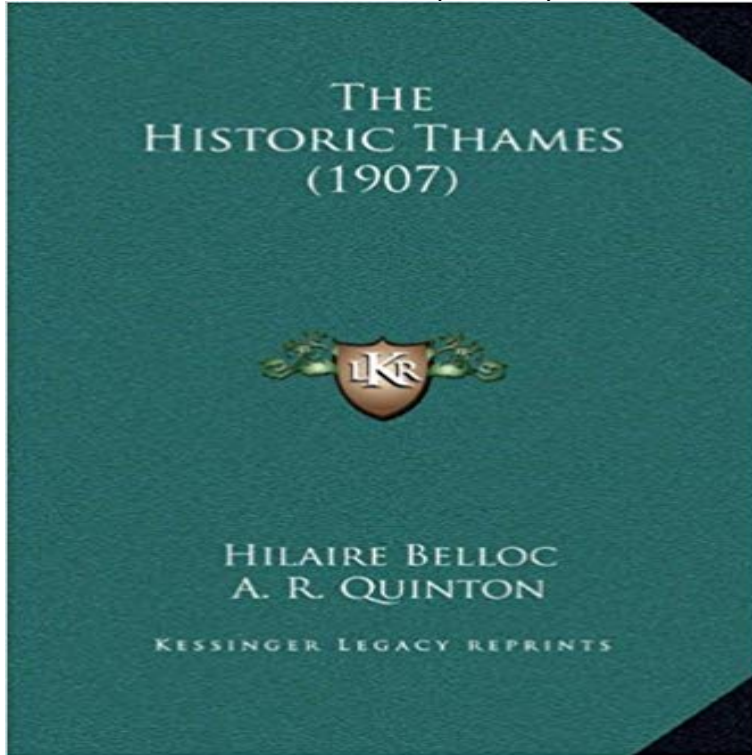


# The Historic Thames (1907)
